# Tyabb Air Show

Sunday 1 March

The weather turned out pretty good, with a top temp of around 30°, compared with two years ago at 40° and a TFB. Winds were calm, allowing aircraft like the Tiger Moths and WW1 Sopwith Pup to take to the air. There was a significant number of aerobatic displays as well.

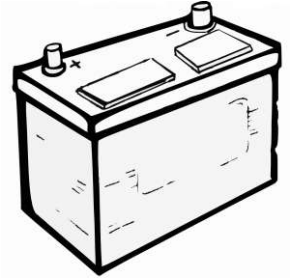

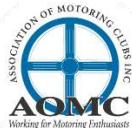
